




The **local curricula were introduced on August 1, 2016** in all schools in grades 1–6. The curricula for grades 7–9 were introduced in stages in 2017–2019.

The basics of the A1 language curriculum 2019 for year classes 1–2 were introduced on January 1, 2020. Revised chapter 6 of the basics The assessment of student learning and competence in basic education was included in local curricula from August 1, 2020. The specified criteria for final evaluation of students were added to the local curricula and introduced at the beginning of the academic year 2021–2022.

The **local curriculum is updated** after the basic changes, but also at other times as needed. The purpose is that the curriculum is a living support for teaching and school operations.

The student sets goals, solves problems and evaluates the learning based on the goals. The student's experiences, feelings, interests and interaction with others create the basis for learning. The teacher's task is to teach and guide the students on the path of continuous learning by taking into account the students' individual ways of learning.

- The school has 20 basic education groups in grades 1 to 6.
- In addition to general education classes, there are small classes 2-3F, 4-5F and 5-6G.
- The school also has city's only elementary music classes for grades 3 6, as well as the city's **English classes** in grades 1-6.
- The school is known as a study program that emphasizes culture and good manners.
- All in all, 35 teachers and 350 students work in the school.
- Other staff are in health care, property maintenance and the kitchen.
- 20 enthusiastic new schoolchildren are admitted to the first grade through the entrance exam, and the number of applicants has grown year by year.
- Swedish is also taught from 6th grade

### Info

- Each student has his/her own schedule
- No shoes in class
- Lunch at school free for all
- Early arrival and late departure (other staff)
- Substitute teachers (not necessarily teachers)
- 1st to 3rd give reports for assessment
- Give grades from 4th to 6th grade

# Designing a modern school, the basics

Kellokoski's school is a KiVa school, Likkuva school and Pro school.
 Kellokoski school's vision 2025 is Well-being

KiVa is an **antibullying program** that has been developed in the University of Turku, Finland, with funding from the Ministry of Education and Culture. The program is evidence-based which means that the effectiveness of KiVa has been proven scientifically.

Finnish Schools on the Move is a **national action programme** aiming to establish a physically active culture in Finnish comprehensive schools. Schools and municipalities participating in the programme implement their own individual plans to increase physical activity during the school day. More than 90% of municipalities and of comprehensive schools (2 116 schools) are involved in the programme.

### 75 minute lessons 1/2

- Kellokoski school took up 75 minute lessons in 2016-17
- Benefits
  - School days less rushed
  - Fewer lessons/ teachers/ day (for pupils)
  - Fewer groups/ day (for teachers)
  - Enables more versatile teaching methods
  - Facilitating cooperation between teachers
  - Curriculum becomes more easily approachable
  - School transport becomes more manageable
  - Shorter school days
  - Fewer break duties
  - Allows more time for tutoring and extra curricular activities





# Planning and organizing together

Meetings on Tuesday mornings for 75 minutes, 4 week rotation

KEKO = the whole teaching staff at Kellokosken koulu

TIKO = functional teams (5 teams, each divided in two)

TAKO = all teaching staff, divided into two groups: grades 0-6 and grades 7-9 and higher

LAKO = grade groups (0-6) and subject groups (7-9)

There's also time outside the school day for individual planning and planning together

The school board/ administration team have a meeting on Mondays for 75 minutes.

Members: 3 principals, 5 team leaders (teachers)

Through Wilma, teachers enter evaluations and absences, update their personal information and communicate with students and guardians.

Through Wilma, guardians monitor and investigate the student's absences, communicate with teachers and read school bulletins.

Wilma is also used by the educational institution's staff, management and workplace supervisors.
